## Manual Removal of Pipeline Coating

SJP-42

### **PURPOSE/APPLICATION**

This SJP provides general steps for the manual removal of pipeline coating on various types of pipes and joint protection/sleeving. Where applicable, the product SDS and any hazard controls should be reviewed prior to work.

### HAZARD SOURCES



#	Job Steps	Hazards	Control Measures		
1	Identify type of coating being removed and gather the appropriate tools	<ul> <li>Motion - Slips or trips on uneven access to excavation</li> <li>Motion - Damaged tools not in proper working condition with guards in place</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Review and sign off on the excavation checklist prior to entry</li> <li>Inspect access/egress and repair if required. If using ladders, ensure ladders are anchored</li> <li>Always carry scrapers and tools into the excavation using a tool bag/pail. Never walk with tools in your hand. Always carry scrapers with scraper pointed downwards</li> <li>Inspect tools prior to each use for missing guards, lose pieces, etc.</li> </ul>		
2	Remove any existing flaked or lifting coating. Pull old coating off by hand, prior to using hand scrapers	<ul> <li>Motion - Muscle strains, hand slipping while scraping off coating or pulling wrap off</li> <li>Motion -Trips or falls on coating or wrap debris</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Warm up and stretch muscles prior to start</li> <li>Use dry gloves when handling scrapers</li> <li>Get help from other workers to pull off large pieces</li> <li>Keep work area clean and clear of tripping hazards</li> </ul>		
3	Use hand scrapers to remove coating	<ul> <li>Motion - Cut potential while using scraper or removing blade, other workers in the line of fire while scraping</li> <li>Gravity - Material left on the ground.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Use Strike/site-approved gloves, cut resistant gloves preferred for working with scrapers</li> <li>Do not scrape the coating towards yourself or other workers. Maintain a minimum of 1 meter spacing between workers</li> <li>Remove scraper blades when scrapers are not being used</li> </ul>

# SJP-42 Manual Removal of Pipeline Coating

#	Job Steps	Hazards	Control Measures		
			<ul> <li>Prior to leaving excavation, remove the blade from the scraper, don't walk with scraper blades still installed in the scraper</li> </ul>		
			<ul> <li>Used or broken blades must be stored in a covered container or disposal bin</li> </ul>		
			<ul> <li>Waster material must be removed from excavation and disposed of properly</li> </ul>		
			<ul> <li>Never climb over the pipe or roll under the pipe with scraper in hand</li> </ul>		

## **ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS**

If equipment is needed to raise or support the pipe review the following precautions:

- Never position yourself between the pipe and the ditch or under the side boom while it is supporting a load.
- Stay clear of swinging or moving pipe.
- Maintain visual contact with the boom/equipment operator.
